GENERAL INFORMATION

Woodfield Farm grows cereals and vegetables, including courgettes, broccoli, beans and salad onions. The farm is situated 2½ miles from Pershore, 8 miles from Worcester which is a cathedral town and 7 miles from Evesham. There are shops, post offices and banks in Pershore. A weekly shopping trip and some fun outings will be arranged by the farm. There is a swimming pool, sports centre and disco nearby. The farm is both general farming and market gardening covering 1,000 acres, growing cereals, potatoes, and a wide range of gardening crops. These crops are irrigated from the River Avon. There is a glasshouse section used for plant raising for outdoor crops. The farm also has a well equipped modern workshop.

ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation is in a hostel and mobile homes. 2-4 people per room with single beds, mattresses, pillows and furniture to keep your belongings in. There are 4 rooms suitable for couples. B & G Nurseries is located in the Worcestershire in England, and it grows lots of different vegetables, including courgettes, tomatoes, chillies, beans, peas and salad crops. The farm is situated 2 miles from the town of Evesham. Birmingham, Cheltenham, and Stratford-upon-Avon are about 25 miles equal distance from the farm and all have excellent shopping facilities and are well worth a visit for their various interesting features. There is a leisure centre and river boating, fishing and some pubs near the farm. Weekly shopping trips will be arranged by the employer and some outings where possible.

ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation is in 7 portacabins. They house 5 people per unit with single, (some double) beds and furniture to keep your belongings in. Some of the accommodation is suitable for couples. Beslee Farms grow marrows, spring greens, courgettes, sweetcorn, and potatoes. The farm is situated in the South East of England, near Southfleet, and there are plenty of local pubs. Local towns are Longfield and Gravesend only 1 mile & 2½ miles away both with railway stations, pubs, shops and entertainment including swimming, bowling and a cinema. There is a bus service from Southfleet to Gravesend. The train to London from these two towns takes only 45 minutes. The ancient city of Rochester is seven miles south with its Norman castle and cathedral. A minibus will be provided for students to get from the cottage to work etc. Mr. Beslee will try to organise a weekly shopping trip, some outings and some barbecues on days off.

ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation will be in mobile homes. Bedrooms will contain beds, mattresses, pillows and furniture to keep your belongings in. Bury Lane farm is a cut flower and arable farm, whose crops include sunflowers, stocks, gladioli, daffodils, lilies, bulbs and potatoes. It is located in the south east of England, 1 mile from Royston and only 12 miles from the historic university town of Cambridge where there are many leisure and shopping facilities. A weekly shopping trip will be arranged by your employer as well as a monthly social trip to Cambridge or nearby towns.

ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation is provided in mobile homes, between 4 and 8 people (single sex) per room with

single beds with mattresses and heaters in all rooms. There is some accommodation for couples, by arrangement in advance with the farm. There are drawers to keep your belongings in, and a fridge freezer in each room. There are toilets, showers and handbasins separate for males and females. The kitchen consists of 6 cookers, 6 fridges, 6 freezers, kettles, cooking pots, crockery and cutlery. There are also 2 washing machines for student use. Outdoor recreational activities include a barbecue. There is a large rest room with some couches, television, pool, table tennis and darts. Students must provide and cook their own food and keep the living areas clean and tidy.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Cedar Farm is a vegetable farm, whose main produce includes potatoes, onions, turnips, peas and butternut squash. It is located in the east of England, half a mile from the village of Alderton, one mile from the village of Hollesley and less than one mile from the beach. There are shops and a Post Office in both villages. Woodbridge is seven miles away with good leisure facilities and supermarkets. The internet is available to access in the local village. Two eight seater mini-buses are available in the evenings and on weekends for which there is a £2.00 weekly charge for **all** students using it to cover diesel and insurance costs.

ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation is in mobile homes sleeping 5/6 in each. There is some accommodation for couples. The mobile homes are equipped with a shower, cooking pots, cutlery, mattresses, tables, chairs, a fridge and a television. There are ten toilets for students use only. There are also washing machines, bicycles, football and the use of a tennis court and barbecue. All students must provide and cook their own food and keep the accommodation clean and tidy.

Damage: Students have a responsibility to keep the living areas clean and tidy. Normal wear and tear will be taken into account, but wilful damage to property must be paid for by the student/s responsible, and may be deducted from wages.

WORKING CONDITIONS AT CEDAR FARM

Type of work:

The type of work available on the farm includes the following:

- Late May to mid-March - harvesting turnips by hand then washing and packing them in the packhouse (on 120 hectares)

- Harvesting and packing butternut squash on 5 hectares (September)
